In order to maximize the number of whole panel submissions and to make it easier on participants to form panels when they only have a single paper topic, this year your submissions will automatically populate a spreadsheet that will show other panels, roundtables and individual papers. There you can take a look at the work of other participants to try to find scholars with whom you can form a panel. This will help avert the danger that your paper would have to be placed on a non-cohesive panel by the organizers. A panel typically consists of a chair, three members and a discussant while a roundtable has a chair and three to five participants.
